During college, Bryan loved media production classes and envisioned owning his own business. Following graduation, the reality of starting a company was daunting. His chosen field of business was capital intensive and highly competitive, so he abandoned his dream and went to work for his father who owned a technology consulting company. To introduce him to this business, Bryan was given different job assignments, but none of them captured his heart.

After a few years of frustration, he attended the Strategic Life Alignment Seminar. Then amazingly, the engineer offered to send Bryan a new Apple computer on long-term loan—in other words, for free! Not only was it free, but the machine was far superior to Bryan's.

Stunned, Bryan could hardly believe his ears. What would motivate this engineer, whom he had never met, to extend this magnanimous offer? Deep inside, Bryan knew the answer—God had answered his prayer and the prayer of his family. Instead of shutting the business down, God was upgrading the business and He did it without money. He did it by moving the heart of a stranger to help His servant Bryan.

The touch from God was tantamount to a "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in a little, now it is promotion time!" Bryan was promoted, although for a while it didn't look like a promotion, which is all too typical of how God works.
